Martin L. Rossman, MD, Dipl.Ac. is a physician, acupuncturist, author, and educator known internationally as a pioneer in the field of guided imagery. He is Founder and Director of the Collaborative Medicine Center in Greenbrae, California and Founder of The Healing Mind, a resource center for evidence-based information and tools for self-healing. Through the Academy for Guided Imagery, a postgraduate training organization which he co-founded, he has taught guided imagery to over 10,000 health professionals. He is the author of Fighting Cancer from Within: How to Use the Power of Your Mind For Healing and Guided Imagery for Self-Healing: An Essential Resource for Anyone Seeking Wellness. Dr. Rossman is a Clinical Associate in the Department of Medicine at UCSF, and a consultant to the Osher Center for Integrative Medicine at UCSF and the Rosenthal Center for Complementary Medicine, Columbia University, New York.
