ment process by writing her stories which evolved into her memoir/self-help book, Living with Colon Cancer: Beating the Odds (Prometheus Books 2005). Eliza is currently completing her second book, Death without Warning: Mourning, Remembering, and Celebrating Lives Cut Short, a resource for families experiencing loss through a sudden and untimely death.
